## Importance of Private Communion With God

#### Introduction

#### **Background**

- Jesus heals a man of advanced leprosy
  - Think of the most nasty disease you can think of x10.
- After fully healing this dude on the spot instantly
  - Jesus told him to not tell anyone what had happened.

# <u>Luke 5:15-16</u> (NLT)

15 But despite Jesus' instructions, the report of his power spread even faster, and vast crowds came to hear him preach and to be healed of their diseases.16 But Jesus often withdrew to the wilderness for prayer.

Title - Whispers In the Wilderness

### Action step / main point-

- Today I want to talk to you about this spiritual truth that **Faith is formed in** the quiet places.

### Introduction

- Wherever you look in the Bible from Genesis to Revelation there is one overarching common theme.
  - God's Plan of Salvation
  - Restoration to Salvation
- Old or New Testament
- **Two thousand years ago**, today, and even two thousand years from now!
  - God's plan is still the same!
- His plan is to bring salvation to his creation, which is you and me!
- What is salvation though?
  - It is the act of being saved!

In this **second part** of, **Am I Really Saved?** I just don't want to talk about the questions on if you are really saved, but **what does it look like to be saved.** 

- God does not just want to save you then leave you
  - God wants to live with you, communion with you, do life with you, and transform you.
  - See there are so many benefits for you when you have an authentic and real relationship with Jesus. Not just a Wednesday night relationship with Jesus.
- Salvation is not the end goal
  - It is the **beginning** of a **new life** with Jesus Christ

- Salvation is not just a get out of hell free card, but once you have accepted Jesus into your life it is a beginning of a new journey, new life, and new identity.
- Jesus does not just want to be hidden within you he wants to walk next to you.

#### Transition-

This brings me to my first point.

Point 1 - Constant Connection

# <u>Verse</u>

# <u>John 15:4-5</u> (NLT)

**4** Remain in me, and I will remain in you. For a branch cannot produce fruit if it is severed from the vine, and you cannot be fruitful unless you remain in me. **5** "Yes, I am the vine; you are the branches. Those who remain in me, and I in them, will produce much fruit. For apart from me you can do nothing.

### Content-

- All relationships take time
- All relationships take connection
- If you never take time to connect with someone, your relationship with them will never grow.
- You can't be bestfriends with someone if you never spend any time with them.
  - **Question**: How often do you and your best friend hangout?
- I love the verses we read above because the Gospel of John paints a symbolic picture of what it looks like to be saved and in Constant Connection with Christ.

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- Jesus is using this metaphor to explain to us that just like a branch cannot produce fruit on its own, we cannot do what we are called to do in our life if we are not connected to God.
- If we are not connected to the source, which is God, we cannot bear fruit or live a fruitful life.
- If you want to produce something great with your life, if you want to live a purposeful life and make a lasting impact you must be connected to the source.

### **Application**

- What does this mean for you today?
  - Make time!
    - Right now set up a time and place to connect with God.
    - **Tell your friends** so they can keep you **accountable.**
  - Pray to God throughout your day and not just right before meals
    - Talk to him as you walk the hallways
    - Talk to him at night before you go to bed and when you wake up.

# **Transition**

 I love what Paul has to say when it comes to being constantly pursuing and being connected to Christ.

# **Background**

In the portion of Scripture I am about to read, Paul is reminding this church, this large group of people that Christ is returning for those that have a relationship with Him. But he tells them to do this in the meantime before Christ does return.

#### <u>Verse</u>

#### 1 Thessalonians 5:17 (NLT)

"Never stop praying."

#### 1 Thessalonians 5:18b (NLT)

"for this is God's will for you who belong to Christ Jesus."

<u>Content</u>

- In Paul's final piece of advice to this church his instructions are simple.
  For those that are connected to the source which is God, "Never stop praying."
- I think if **Paul was here right now**, he would give you the **same advice**.
  - Never stop praying to God
  - Never stop meeting with God
  - Never stop talking to God
  - Never stop **seeking** God
  - Never stop **pursuing** God
    - Never stop being in CONSTANT CONNECTION with God.
- What I have come to learn in my life is that to be a true disciple of Jesus are disciplined.
  - A disciple of Jesus is someone that is disciplined in pursuing Him.
- It can get hard at times, life can get busy, and things will always be trying to take your attention off of God and place it on something else.
- But when you know the true source, which is God, you know that your time with God, even the time that no one sees is the most important thing and it keeps you connected to the source.
- You might say to yourself, <u>"Well David, I understand that I need to be</u> <u>connected to God</u>, <u>but how do I do that?"</u>
- Your relationship with God is not a passive relationship, just like your relationship with your friends is not a passive relationship where you do nothing at all.
- Your relationship with God requires you to be active and take action.
  - We cannot just spend time with God once a week when it is convenient for us because there is a youth group that puts on a whole service for ua.
  - Just like branches cannot grow without the vine, we cannot grow
    spiritually by doing nothing and not being active in our faith.

Closing statement

- I want to give you a little Illustration to maybe show you the importance of consistent and constant Connection with God and how that can help you grow.
  - I want you to look at your faith like it is a mussel.
  - How many of you workout, exercise, or play sports?

#### **Illustration**

- Lifting weights

# <u>Content</u>

- It does not just make you stronger spiritually.
- When you are connected with God and you are consistently pursuing Him through praying and reading your Bible there are so many benefits that come from the time with God.
  - 1. Strengthens your Faith
  - 2. Guidances and Wisdom
  - 3. Peace and Comfort
    - a. I promise you, getting closer to the source (God) will make your **fear** and **anxiety flee**
  - 4. Joy and Fulfillment
    - a. **True Joy and lasting Fulfillment** can only come from connection with God.
  - 5. Healing
  - 6. Hope
  - 7. Understanding of God's Will for your life.

# **Application**

- What does this mean for you today?
  - If you want to grow:
    - You need to be active in your faith
    - You need to be reading your Bible
    - You need to be praying
    - You need to be worshiping
    - You need to be spending time with other Christian friends
    - You need to be showing up to church

I know there is a generation of young people that are ready to say I am here to grow and be in constant connection with God because there is no place better and more fulfilling than being directly connected to the one that created me.
