Main Points

The Gospel is Good News, Not Good Advice

Jared explains that the gospel is the good news of what God has done for us through Jesus, not a set of advice or rules to follow. He contrasts Christianity with other religions that view God as a mountain to climb through good works, while the gospel is about God coming down to us.

The Gospel Grows Us Up

Jared emphasizes that the gospel is for new believers and ongoing spiritual growth and sanctification. He shares an example of students who appeared to be mature Christians but ultimately walked away from their faith because their behavior was motivated by a desire for approval rather than a transformed heart.

The Gospel is About 'We,' Not Just 'Me'

Jared explains that the gospel has implications beyond individual salvation, including community, creation care, and all aspects of life. He cautions against a narrow view of the gospel that focuses only on personal justification or humanity when the gospel has implications for all creation.

- In preaching and teaching, apply the gospel to the root issues and motivations of students' hearts, not just address behavior.
- Broaden the view of the gospel beyond individual salvation to include implications for community, creation care, and all aspects of life.
